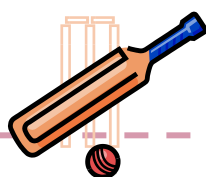
Well done to the pupils who participated in the North Lincolnshire School's Golf Open at Normanby Hall Golf Club on Friday 17th June.

Netbook Support & Insurance Claims during the Holidays

Advice, Information & Simple Problems

If you simply require advice, information or you believe you have a simple problem that can be resolved yourself with instructions from the support team you should e-mail: helpdesk@northlincs.net

Where possible please try to send the e-mail from your college e-mail address, the one that begins with "4075". A support request will then be created and you will receive a response via e-mail as soon as possible.

Other Problems

If you have a problem with your netbook such as it not turning on, freezing, crashing etc then you can bring it into college between the following times:

Every Wednesday 10am – 1pm

If your netbook can be repaired within 15 minutes it will be done whilst you wait, if not you will be given a day/time to come back.

Insurance Claims for Damage

If something has happened to your netbook and it requires us to claim on the insurance you MUST bring it in within 1 week of the incident between the following times:

Every Wednesday 10am – 1pm

You will need to give an explanation of what happened, where you were and the date and time, please ensure you have this information ready when you come in. Failure to do this may result in us being unable to claim on the insurance leaving you liable for the cost of repair or replacement.

Insurance Claims for Theft

If your netbook is stolen you MUST report it to the police within 24 hours and provide the school with the following information as soon as possible, you can do this by e-mailing helpdesk@northlincs.net at any time or calling 01724 860237 on weekdays between 9am – 3pm.

The netbook is a **Black Gateway LT25**, you need to inform the police that the netbook is the property of **Brumby Engineering College**, when you provide us with the log number we will contact the police and provide them with the serial number of the netbook and any further details they may require from us.

- The name of student the netbook was issued to
- Log Number/Crime Number
- The name of the police force you reported it to
- A contact number for the above police force (If not Humberside Police)
- The Date/Time you reported it to the police
- The Date/Time the theft was discovered, where it was and as much detail as possible about the incident.

If the theft happened in the Humberside Police area their contact number is 0845 60 60 222.

Failure to do this may result in us being unable to claim on the insurance leaving you liable for the cost of replacement.

Taking Care of your Netbook

Always	Never
Carry your netbook in the bag provided	Place items such as food and drink in your netbook bag
Ensure all liquids and food are kept away from your netbook	Leave items such as pens etc on the keyboard and close the lid
Hold and lift your netbook by its base	Leave cables dangling where they can get caught and your netbook pulled to the floor
Plug accessories into their proper slots at the correct angle	Swing the bag in which your netbook is contained as it may hit something and damage your netbook
Be aware of health & safety requirements to ensure your netbook cables are not in walkways	Leave your netbook on a desk as they have a habit of going "walkabout"
Store your netbook in the bag provided carefully out of public view when not in use	Place your netbook under other items, the screen may get damaged
Keep your netbook with you at all times whilst using public transport	Place your netbook on uneven or unstable surfaces
Keep young children away from your netbook both when in use and when not in use	Hold and lift your netbook by its screen
Report damage and problems to the school as soon as possible	Press or touch your netbook screen
	Leave your netbook unattended
	Insert any foreign objects into your netbook
	Attempt to repair your netbook yourself

IMPORTANT

You MUST NOT let anyone else use your netbook this includes family members and other students. The insurance policy only covers the netbook for use by the student it was issued to.

If you do let anyone else use it and it is damaged you may be liable for the cost of repair or replacement.
